Apalachee High School: Highway 53 thru Winder. At McDonalds, go straight. This road becomes Hwy. 81. Follow 81 across Hwy 316 (BP station on left). Follow the highway until the 1st stop sign & turn right onto Carl-Bethleham Road. Go 1/4 mile and take 1st left onto Haymon-Morris Road. Go 1 1/4 mile. Apalachee High School is on the left. 1st drive is for sports activities.

Buford High School-I-985 South to Exit 8. Turn right at the end of ramp. After turning right, go to the third traffic light, and turn left onto Buford Highway. Just before Buford Highway turns into a four lane, turn right onto Sawnee Ave. - should be a sign saying Buford High School. School is up the hill (about 1/4 mile) on the right. 2750 Sawnee Ave.

C.W. Davis Middle School – Go 985 S. Take Exit 17. Take ramp right for GA 53 toward Dawsonville/Oakwood. Go 1.2 miles. Turn left onto GA 53 Mundy Mill Road. Go 0.4 miles. Turn right on GA 13 S. Atlanta Highway. Go Straight. Atlanta Highway turns into Falcon Parkway. 4335 Falcon Parkway, Flowery Branch, GA

East Hall High School - Go Jesse Jewel Parkway . Go under I-985. Road changes into Old Cornelia Highway . School will be approximately 2 miles on your right. Baseball, soccer, and football fields are approximately on mile down Old Cornelia Highway on the opposite side of the road as the school.

Northview High School- Go 985 S. 20.2 miles. Merge onto I-85 S. Take exit 111 toward Suwanee. Turn right onto GA 317 Lawrenceville Suwanee Road. Go .6 miles and turn left onto Satellite Blvd. Go 1 mile and turn right onto McGinnis Ferry Goad. Go 4.3 miles and turn left onto Bell Road/Sheltonville Alpha Road. Go 2.2 miles and continue onto Boles Road. Go .9 miles and turn right onto Abbots Bridge Road. Go .3 miles and turn left onto Parsons Road. 10625 Parsons Road, Duluth will be on the right.

Riverside Military Academy-Go Green Street (Highway 60/129 North). When road forks at Civic Center, go right (129 North). Take 2nd left past Rick's Smokin' Pig/Pasquale's onto Riverside Drive. School is at 2001 Riverside Drive.

West Hall-Go Brown's Bridge Road West to McEver Road (@ Hall County Government Offices. Turn left onto McEver Road . Go 4-5 miles. School will be on right on McEver Road

West Laurens High School- Go I 985 South 20.3 miles. Merge onto I-85 South. Go 16.9 miles. Go I285 East toward Augusta/Macon. Go 18.8 miles. . At Exit 52, take ramp right for I-675 South toward Macon. Go 11.3 miles. Keep straight onto I-75 South. Go 62.1 miles. At Exit 165, take ramp for I-16 East toward Savannah. Go 48 miles. At exit 49, take ramp right for GA 257 toward Dublin. Turn right onto GA 257. Go 4.2 miles. Arrive at 3692 Highway 257, Dexter, GA.
